After completing Classical High School, in 1996-1997, he graduated in Law in Padua University, with a dissertation about 'La *condictio incerti*', under Professor A. Burdese's direction.
In 1999 he won a grant at the Department of Law in Padua University (SSD IUS 18), with a dissertation about 'La problematica della causa nel contesto del contratto'.
In 2000 he got the diploma of the 'Law Application School' at the Faculty of Law in Padua University. During these years, he worked as Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Law in Padua, Verona and Udine Universities.
In 2001 he deepened the investigation about Roman Law and European Private Law at the Faculty of Law in Salzburg, under Professor J.M. Rainer's direction.
Since 2002 he was a Researcher at the Faculty of Law in Padua University (SSD IUS 18).
In 2003 he became Professor of 'Foundations of European Private Law' and 'Roman Law' at the 'Scuola per le Professioni Legali' at the Faculty of Law in Verona and Trento Universities.
Since 2006 he is Professor of 'Institutions of Roman Law', 'Foundations of European Private Law' and 'Foundations and Models in Sales Law' in Verona University.

During these years, he gained many funds for researches in Roman and European Law: PRIN 2004; PRIN 2008; PRIN 2010; Project for the internationalisation MIUR 2006; Research project of another University (formerly 60% share) 2006; Research project of another University (formerly 60% share) 2006-2007; Research project of another University (formerly 60% share) 2008; Research project of another University (2013); Marie Curie 2015; Project funded by the 'Centro Italo-Tedesco per l'Eccellenza Europea di Villa Vigoni' 2016.

To improve his research skills, he spent several months abroad: in 2003 he was 'Mitarbeiter' at Max Planck Institut of Frankfurt, under Professor T. Giaro's direction and, in 2004, he was 'Mitarbeiter' at Max Planck Institut of Hamburg, under Professor R. Zimmermann's direction. He has participated in teaching and research activities in each Institute. In 2007 he has been 'Visiting Professor' at the University of Heidelberg; in 2008 he was 'Mitarbeiter' at Leopold Wenger Institut of München; in 2010 he has been 'Visiting Professor' at the Universities of Buenos Aires and Mendoza; in 2012 he has been 'Visiting Professor' at the New York University; in 2013 he has been 'Visiting Professor' at the University of Paris I - Sorbonne-Panthéon; in 2015 he has been 'Visiting Professor' at the Humboldt University of Berlin.

He keeps academic relationships with many foreign Universities (such as Salzburg, Heidelberg, Moscow, Madrid, Munich, Buenos Aires - Uba and Austral) and Research Institutes (Frankfurt and Hamburg 'Max Plank Institut' and Moscow Academy of Science).

He is member of the Scientific Committee of some reviews, both Italian and foreign, such as 'Seminarios Complutenses de Derecho Romano. Revista internacional de Derecho Romano y de Tradición Romanística', 'Legal Roots', 'Interpretatio Prudentium. Direito Romano e Tradição Romanista em Revista', 'Annaeus. Anales de la tradición romanística', 'Diritto civile contemporaneo', 'Ephemerides'.

He is referee for the reviews 'Teoria e storia del diritto privato' and 'Annali dell'Università di Palermo' and for the publishing series of the Department of the Universities Roma Tre, Roma Tor Vergata, and Jean Monnet - Bari.

His research interests in the field of Roman, Civil and European Law, include Procedural Law, Sales Law, Good Faith Principle and Arbitration Law. Author of many publications in Italian reviews (such as 'IVRA', 'Index', 'Rivista di Diritto Civile', 'Giurisprudenza Italiana', 'Corriere Giuridico', 'Nuova Giurisprudenza Civile Commentata') and in foreign reviews (such as 'Seminarios Complutenses de Derecho Romano', 'Zeitschrift fur Gemenischtsprivatrecht'), he has participated in many conferences in Italy and abroad (for example, in 2007, in Shanghai, giving a speech entitled 'Real Rights: Historical Experience, Modern Development and Comparative Perspective in the Continental Legal System' and in 2009 at the University of Madrid 'Complutense', about contract problems; in 2010, in Saint Petersburg, about 'Roman Law and the Culture of Private Law in Europe'; in 2011, in Buenos Aires, at the 'Congreso internacional de derecho privado'; in 2014, in Shanghai, at the International Symposium on 'Roman Law between Tradition and modernity').
