**Current academic position**

Since 2002, Associate Professor of Institutions of Public Law (SSD IUS/09) in the Department of Legal Studies of the University of Verona; academic position confirmed since 2005.

From 1986 to 2002 he was Assistant Professor at the University of Modern Languages (I.U.L.M.) in Milan (from 1986 to 1998), and at the “Free University of Languages and Communication - IULM” (from 1998 to 2002). It was confirmed in the academic position in 1989 first in the SSD N04 (Comparative public law), then, since 2000, in the SSD IUS/08 (Constitutional Law).

**Education and training**

He graduated in Law at University of Pavia in 1981, with a thesis in Constitutional Law (coord. Prof. Valerio Onida; co-coord. Prof. Sergio Bartole) on the topic “*Structure and settlement of the Government in the Republican praxis*”, obtaining the maximum mention cum laude (110/110 cum laude).

From 1981 to 1986 was *Cultore della materia* (non-tenured track Lecturer) in Constitutional Law at the Faculty of Law, Pavia University.

In 1982 attended as biyearly bursar the post-graduated Master in Law of Environment and Territory at the Faculty of Law, Pavia University.

In 1983 was eighteen-months Research Fellow at the Lombardia Regional Council to carry on a research concerning “*The regional administration through the boards. A comparative analysis between Lombardia and Piemonte Regions*”.

From 1983 to 1987 was Adjunct Professor in Constitutional and Public Law at the School for Social services of Verona, settled by the local Consortium for the University careers.

In 1983 was *Cultore della materia* in Public Law Institutions at Faculty of Economics, University “Cattolica del Sacro Cuore”, Milan; from 1983 to 1985, in Public Law Institutions at Faculty of Economics, Verona University; from 1983 to 1986, in Public Law Institutions at the Modern Languages University Institute (I.U.L.M.), Milan; from 1983 to 1996, in Constitutional Law, Milan University.

In 1986 was appointed as Assistant Professor at I.U.L.M. and as confirmed from November 10<sup>th</sup>, 1989 to December 29<sup>th</sup>, 2002, in the scientific section N04 (until from 2000) and successively, IUS08 (Constitutional Law).

In 1987 achieved the post-graduate Degree in Law of Environment and Territory at the Faculty of Law, Pavia University obtaining the maximum mention cum laude (50/50 cum laude), discussing a thesis on the protection of the environment in Switzerland (coord. Prof. Giuseppe Franco Ferrari).

## Research Experience

From 1982 to 1983 took part of the research group funded by the Italian National Research Center (C.N.R.) and coordinated by Prof. Valerio Onida on the topic "*Structure, settlement and activities of the Government*", at University of Pavia.

From 1983 to 1984 participated to the research sponsored by *Istituto per la Scienza dell'Amministrazione Pubblica* (I.S.A.P.), in Milan, concerning "*The Regional committee of control in the Lombardia Region*", coord. Prof. Sergio Bartole.

From 1984 to 1985 took part of the research group settled in the post-graduated Environment and

territory, Law School, University of Pavia, on “*Some foreign models of environmental protection*”, coord. Prof. Giuseppe Franco Ferrari. In particular, he focused on the Swiss constitutional system.

From 1984 to 1996 took part of the research group carrying the topic “*Praxis of the constitutional bodies*”, at Milan University. This research obtained a previous funding by the C.N.R. and the Ministry of the Public Education, coordinated by Prof. Valerio Onida and then sponsored by the Ministry for the University and the Scientific and Technological Research. From 1987 to 1988, in collaboration with other researches and under the coordination of Prof. Valerio Onida, he analyzed by a critical point of view the political and constitutional events linked to the crisis of the Government during the I and II Craxi tasks (1985-1987) to assess the enacting of the involved rules, especially the constitutional ones. He focused his research on the President of the Republic and his role.

From 1988 to 1989 hold on this research, also considering the analysis of the law n. n. 400/1988, containing also the regulation of the Council of Ministries Presidency. In particular, he considered the so-called *Ministri senza portafoglio* and the Vice-President of the Council.

In 1990, assisted by Prof. Valerio Onida and Dr. Antonio D’Andrea, he focused the research on the praxis concerning the composition, the structure and some functions of the Government. At the same time, he studied in depth the role of the President of the Republic, with particular reference to the relationship with the President of the Council and the Government.

In 1991, he continued the mentioned research issues, concluding the analysis of the authorization to present government law proposal in the republican praxis.

In 1991 and 1992, he also focused on the role of the Supreme Defense Council, considering the relations between the President of the Republic and the President of the Council, the conceivable institutional reforms resulting by the President of the Republic and the reform of the article 79 of the Constitution.

Since 1993, even though he continued the research on the Italian system (with particular reference to the praxis and the rules concerning the constitutional bodies), he focused on some foreign countries: Switzerland, Belgium and Canada. He worked with Prof. Blaise Knapp and Prof. Giorgio Malinverni on Switzerland and with Prof. Nino Olivetti Rason and Prof. Lucio Pegoraro on Belgium and Canada.

Since 2003, he focused on the analysis of the Italian social rights. He was responsible of three Projects funded by the University of Verona on “*The social rights and the reform of the Title V, Part II of the Constitution*” (2003-2004); “*Social citizenship and Regions*” (2005-2006); “*The regional and local perspective defining the rules on the interventions and social services integrated system*” (2006-2008).

From 2005 to 2007 he participated to the PRIN research group under the coordination of Prof. Valerio Onida and the coordination of Prof. Paolo Cavaleri on the topic “*From the rights Courts to the disputes Courts: the last tendencies of the jurisprudence and the role of the Constitutional Court*”.

From 2009 to 2012, he was responsible for a research project funded by the University of Verona

concerning “Social services in the process of European integration”.

In 2011 he joined a group of scholars and researchers, belonging to the “Réseau Académique sur la Charte Sociale Européenne et les Droits sociaux / Academic Network on European Social Charter and Social Rights - RACSE / ANESC”, which carries out research activities on the recognition and effective protection of social rights in Europe.

In 2012 he took part, as coordinator of the Operational Unit n. 7, based at the University of Verona, on the PRIN project entitled: “Theory and practice of democratic parliaments: from institutional analysis to quantitative evaluations”; the project, of which Prof. Jörg Luther was scientific coordinator, was positively evaluated.

From 2012 to 2013, he was part of a Project of the Seventh FP, funded by the European Commission, entitled: “Longevity as a challenge”.
